

## Port of Halifax – COVID-19 Update – November 23, 2020

The Halifax Port Authority has demonstrated since the onset of COVID-19 in March that safety is our top priority. Starting Tuesday, November 24, 2020 all non-essential HPA staff will be required to work from home for the next two weeks after which the situation will be re-evaluated.

The message coming from public health officials in Nova Scotia is loud and clear: **we all need to work together right now to limit the spread of COVID-19** and minimize the effects of the second wave. The list of exposure locations across Halifax Regional Municipality is growing daily.

It remains important for Nova Scotians to strictly adhere to public health orders and directives by practicing good hand washing and other hygiene steps, maintain physical distancing as necessary, wear face masks, and limit all non-essential activities and travel.
